Brothers, Vivat Jesus! Membership of our order is always an ongoing job for all of us. I want to share some important Questions & Answers about the Knights of Columbus.

#### 1. I don't have time to join another organization; why should I join the Knights of Columbus?

As a Knight you can choose the projects with which you wish to be involved in within your own community. What is more, the Order is dedicated to family life and the many benefits it offers. From insurance to scholarships to service and social activities and programs, all are open to the whole family. Don't forget the (24 hour Knight). The new member does not by any means have to drop everything to become a Knight. (24 hours per year of service time, includes helping with charitable events, reading the newsletters, attending meetings, family gatherings at service projects, helping with our annual yard sale, ice cream social, vocation breakfast, helping with our parish needs.

## 2. What are the requirements?

Membership in the Knights of Columbus is open to men 18 years of age or older who are practical (that is, practicing) Catholics in union with the Holy See.

#### 3. What is a practical Catholic?

A practical Catholic accepts the teaching authority of the Catholic Church on matters of faith and morals, aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the Catholic Church, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church.

#### 4. Explain what Degrees are?

There are four degrees within the Knights of Columbus. Each degree ceremony imparts a lesson on the Order's core virtues of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.

# 5. Do I have to purchase Insurance to become a member?

No; unlike many fraternal organizations one does not become a member by purchasing insurance. In the Knights of Columbus a man has to be a member before he may avail himself of the insurance benefit.

# **Moments of Truths**

Gary Laurestein, CSsR Before a funeral Mass, a parishioner told the priest, "Father, I know the pallbearers are baptized, but I'm not sure whether they're confirmed." Puzzled, the priest asked, "Why do you want to know that'?" The parishioner replied, "The funeral director said I should make sure the pallbearers are confirmed."

Of course, the funeral director was talking about verifying the pallbearers' commitment to be at the Mass. The parishioner, having a Catholic mentality, thought the pallbearer was speaking about the sacrament of confirmation.

Some of us begin learning about Catholicism from birth. Perhaps we were blessed with parents who set a good example and a childhood religious education that had a great impact on us. As adults, our education continues. We regularly attend Mass. We take religion classes at our parish or watch Catholic programs on TV or on the Internet. Maybe we read Catholic books, magazines, newspapers, blogs, and websites.

Such things help us to know more about our faith, but there's anotherstep-internalizing our Catholic faith, drinking it in deeply. This happens only through meditation.

One way to do this is to meditate on the Catechism of the Catholic Church one I article at a time. Each meditation is a conversation with the Lord about how an article of faith applies to everyday life. Meditating on the Catechism offers an opportunity of petition for humility and faith. Granted, going through the whole Catechism is a very long exercise, but the Catechism is the most authentic source of our faith. If it's too much, have a conversation with the Lord over a source of Catholic teaching you find more accessible. But do have the conversation.

If we don't read and meditate on the truths of our faith, we risk being like the man who was asked whether he believed that people today are more ignorant and apathetic than those of previous generations. He said, "I don't know, and I don't care."•

How one generation compares to another doesn't matter. What matters is that the truths of our faith become part of us and of how we live.

# **Roots of Devotion**

Did you know that May is the month of Mary? Throughout the centuries, the Church has set aside the month of May to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in a special way. This custom has been strongly endorsed by popes as far back as the thirteenth century.

During the Second Vatican Council, the bishops proclaimed Marv to be Mother of the Church and asked for her intercession as they gathered and formulated documents. Before the council's final session in 1965, Pope Paul VI issued the encyclical On Prayers During May for Preservation of Peace (Mense Maia), in which he asked world leaders to embrace peace. Specifically, he spoke out on crimes against the dignity of the human person, warfare, terrorist activities, hostage-taking, and other acts of violence. The pope called for every parish and diocese to pray, especially during May, for the Blessed Mother's help and protection. Mary-related liturgical celebrations also occur in May. The Feast of the Visitation (May 31) commemorates the day Our Lady hurried to the aid of her elderly relative Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John the Baptist. Before 1969, the Saturday after the Ascension of Our Lord celebrated as the Feast of Our Lady, Queen of the Apostles, to recall the day the apostles gathered in prayer with Mary and the women in the Upper Room. This year the month of Mary falls during the Easter season. Vatican II documents instruct the faithful that all devotions must ultimately flow, harmonize with the Church seasons, and lead us back to the liturgy. Thus, this May our Mary devotions will emphasize Our Lady's participation in the paschal mystery and recall Pentecost, the event that gave birth to the Church. During Mary's month in the Easter season, all of nature rejoices with the Queen of Heaven at the resurrection of the Lord. During the remainder of this Easter season, may our devotion to Mary and our participation in the liturgy deepen our gratitude for the mystery of our baptismal rebirth in Christ Jesus.
