The tears of happiness and the many God Bless You's and Merry Christmases we received were overwhelming. Did any of the Brother Knights who gave so much happiness and love to so many of the developmentally disabled care if those people they were helping were young or old, white or black, Christian, Jew, or Muslim, or from Madison Heights, Warren, Sterling Heights, Troy, etc. NO! NO! NO! Who cares? Everyone was doing God's work and we were doing real good in a world that is anything but real good. How much good did our council, Fr. James B. Heary Council 7239, do?
