## **Linking Past, Present, Future**

At my father's funeral, I received my grandfathers wedding ring, which had been passed down to my father when my grandfather passed away. Now the ring had been given to me. I thought about how this ring had been on my grandfather's hand through nearly every major event of his sixty-seven years of married life through World War II, while working on the family farm, when he held his sons for the first time and when he held my grandmothers hand. I never felt so close to my grandfather as when I put that ring on my finger.

We have relics in the Church because people need a tangible link to the past, and that link transforms the past into the present. When we come into contact with an object, our minds and hearts are flooded with memories, stories, and emotions. Consider how many people who are in love keep a photo of the person they love. The loved one could be on the other side of the world, but that photo makes them feel close and reminds them of the person they love. And, because the memory is kept alive, it affects how a person acts. People want to behave in a . way that will continue to honor the relationship they have.

One might say that relics are just material objects that don't do anything; they have no magical abilities. But what they represent profoundly affects us. It is like an autograph from a famous person. The autograph actually is just ink on paper. But it serves as a reminder of the person who signed it, and for a brief moment you were in that individuals presence.

Relics call to mind the lives of the saints. They help us remember the stories of the past and build upon those stories for the future. The relics of the saints remind us that we are always in the presence of a great cloud of witnesses who intercede for us, encourage us, and assist us. The relics do not bring the saints closer to us. Instead, they help us to grow closer to the saints. We feel connected to the men and women who have been witnesses to the faith. We aspire to be more like them and feel compelled to give our lives as a testimony to the faith we profess.

Every time I wear my grandfather's wedding ring, I know that I aspire to make him proud of me. I know that I honor his memory by how I live my life each day. The little band carries with it traditions and memories that live on through my life and help me to be the best man I can be.
