MOMENTS OF TRUTHS

Before a Funeral Mass, a parishioner told the priest, "Father, I know the pallbearers are baptized, but I'm not sure whether they're confirmed." Puzzled, the priest asked, "Why do you want to know that?" The parishioner replied, "The funeral director said I should make sure the pallbearers are confirmed." Of course, the funeral director was talking about verifying the pallbearers' commitment to be at the Mass. The parishioner, having a Catholic mentality, thought the pallbearer was speaking about the sacrament of confirmation. People like this parishioner including most readers-have internalized what they've learned about our faith. Some of us begin learning about Catholicism from birth. Perhaps we were blessed with parents who set a good example and a childhood religious education that had a great impact on us. As adults, our education continues. We regularly attend Mass. We take religion classes at our parish or watch Catholic programs on TV or on the Internet. Maybe we read Catholic books, magazines, Ânewspapers, blogs, and websites. Such things help us to know more about our faith, but there's another step-internalizing our Catholic faith, drinking it in deeply. This happens only through meditation.

One way to do this is to meditate on the Catechism of the Catholic Church one article at a time. Each meditation is a conversation with the Lord about how an article of faith applies to everyday life. Meditating on the Catechism offers an opportunity of petition for humility and faith. Granted, going through the whole I Catechism is a very long exercise, but the Catechism is the most authentic source of our faith. If it's too much, have a conversation with the Lord over a source of Catholic teaching you find more accessible. But do have the conversation. If we don't read and meditate on the truths of our faith, we risk being like the man who was asked whether the believed whether people today are more ignorant and apathetic than those of previous generations. He said, "I don't know, and I don't care."

How one generation compares to another doesn't matter. What matters is that the truths of our faith become part of us and of how we live.

In the Divine Potter's Hands By Johan Van Parys

My father was a great storyteller, Every night he read from the Bible. He had the talent to depict biblical scenes in such a way that we could see them unfold in our minds' eyes. I clearly remember the night he read the creation story to us. Though I loved all the other stories, I was mostly intrigued by the creation of Adam, I visualized God collecting the clay before lovingly molding Adam and blowing life into him. X This image of God as primordial potter molded and shaped me as well.

There is something wholesome, something sacred, about pottery. Pottery is about clay, and clay is about soil; in Adam's case, primordial soil. Pottery, of course, is not only about clay it also bears the imprint of the potter's hands. A potter takes the clay and judges its quality and its consistency.

She carefully places a lump of clay on the potter's wheel and starts spinning it. She works the clay with her skillful hands as the undefined mass of clay takes shape, never giving up on the clay, starting over until she is pleased with the result.

As every cup bears the imprint of its maker's hands, so each member of the human race bears the imprint of the Divine Potter's hands. But unlike a cup, which can't be changed once it's tired, humans can be reshaped. God shaped humans in his own image, and he continues to mold and remold us. In the sacred lituray, we're molded and remolded by God; this is our time to worship and God's, (I time to shape. I, During the celebration of the liturgy, God molds us, into the Body of Christ. The liturgy is the divine hands, and we are the clay. Sunday after Sunday, we're shaped and reshaped. In liturgy upon liturgy, God focuses and refocuses us on what is right. During our ongoing catechesis, we have or the opportunity to learn more about what God has in mind for us as it is revealed to us through Scripture and Tradition,

Any potter knows it's difficult to create the perfect shape and that it takes a long time to get it just right. Similarly, becoming a good Christian isn't an easy task. It takes a life-long commitment to celebrate the liturgy and to engage in learning so we can live a truly Christian life. However, thanks to God's persistence and unfailing commitment to keep shaping and reshaping us, one day we'll be molded into perfect shape as members of the Body of Christ.
