September 1, 2014 will mark the **75**th **Anniversary** of the start of World War Two. Nazi Germany invaded Poland on Sept. 1, 1939. The Nazis expected a quick capitulation and surrender of the Polish nation. Instead, Poland declared war on Nazi Germany. Defeated in the early stages of the war, she never surrendered. Many of her armies escaped imprisonment by the advancing German troops. Polish soldiers fought side by side with the allied armies throughout the war, most notably at the Battle of Britain, the Siege of Tobruk, the Invasion of France and the Battle of Monte Cassino. First to fight against the Nazis, Poland fought heroically until the very last day of the war.

On the home front, Poland set up **NO** collaborationist government as did other conquered countries. Instead, the government of Poland set up in exile and orchestrated a "Home Army" movement where men, women and children sabotaged the Nazi invaders and valiantly fought an underground war against their oppressors.

MORE THAN JUST A GOD IDEA Fr. Bru

Popes Paul VI, John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis have something in common other than the papacy: a focus on the new evangelization. Paul VI popularized the term in his 1975 apostolic exhortation Evangelii Nuntiandi. John Paul II explained it in great detail in his 1990 encyclical letter Redemptoris Missio, in which he called for a new kind of evangelization — new in its ardor, methods, and expression. John Paul II was a missionary to the world who preached the gospel to countless people in many countries and cultures. Benedict XVI offered writings and lectures that focused on living the truth of the faith. Francis is drawing our attention to affording loving service to the poor and marginalized. Each of these popes has presented concrete ideas to make the new evangelization real in the here and now.

What's the point? After the promulgation of brilliant documents like Evangelii Nuntiandi, Redemptoris Missio, and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops 2002 document Go and Make Disciples, after witnessing the missionary example of Church leadership, and after years of hearing and reading about new evangelization, where is it? In everyday U.S. Catholic life, I don't see or experience it. It seems that the new evangelization — a really great idea — has pretty much stayed just that: a great idea, a theological concept. The first Catholics to arrive on this continent were zealous missionaries who built log cabin chapels and searched the wilderness for lost souls. The missionary spirit gave way to brick-and-mortar parishes, schools, and charitable institutions. were sent in droves to other countries. Once it was well established, the U.S. Catholic Church stopped going out to evangelize and became the place people came to for the sacraments — and that's where we find ourselves today. Most of us have never lived in or experienced a "missionary" Church; until we can achieve greater balance between sacramental ministry and missionary zeal, it seems the ministry of the U.S. Church will remain predominantly sacramental — and the new evangelization will continue to be nothing more than a theological concept.

Nostalgia may be the greatest enemy of new evangelization. Some Catholics long for the good old days, but they're longing for the wrong good old days the days of overcrowded churches and parochial schools, when everyone in the neighborhood was Catholic and the parish was the center of the world. Instead, we should be pining for the days of frontier missionaries who trekked for days through the woods just to find one abandoned soul.
